Strong body and mind were two characteristics Charles Skorupa embodied during his life as a Montana farmer. Chuck began farming and ranching on his own in 1950, beginning with leasing a farm in Bridger, Montana. A great passion was his membership and involvement with the National Farmer's Organization.
